

INSTRUCTIONS FOR EXPIRED CERTIFICATE

Stop! Not everyone who has an expired certificate needs to complete the Expired Certificate Application or test. Use the box below to see which action you must take to regain certification in your specific case. Only those that need to test for recertification should complete page 2 of this Application and submit it to UNAR. **Only PDF versions of the Application will be accepted by email. JPEG, TIFF, PNG or photos of the Application will not be accepted and will be returned for correct resubmission.**

Read the statements below to determine which action you need to take.

- I have worked the minimum 200 required paid work hours and I am within 6 months of my expiration date.

You do not need to test or complete the Expired Certificate Application. You are able to recertify by returning a completed **renewal notice** along with the applicable late fees. If you do not have a renewal notice, download one from your TMU account. If you need access to your TMU account, request your log in information by emailing office@utahcnaregistry.com. Include your full name, date of birth, and the last 4-digits of your social security number in your request.

- I am more than 6 months, but less than 24 months expired and/or I do not have the minimum 200 required paid work hours.

You need to test and are able to recertify by passing both the state knowledge and skills certification exams. Complete page 2 and submit it to UNAR as directed above. You must complete testing within 24 months of your expiration date. If you do not, you will be required to complete an approved training program to regain certification.

- I am not expired but I do not have the minimum 200 required paid work hours.

You need to test and are able to recertify by passing both the state knowledge and skills certification exams. Complete page 2 and submit it to UNAR as directed above. You may submit this Application up to 3 months prior to your expiration date and must complete testing within 24 months of your expiration date.

- I am more than 24 months expired.

You cannot renew your certification. If you would like to become certified, you must complete an approved training program to regain certification. Visit our website, utahcnaregistry.com, to view our list of approved training programs.

- My Utah CNA certificate is expired but I have an active CNA certification in another state.

You do not need to test and may be eligible to renew your certificate by means of Reciprocity. Visit our website at utahcnaregistry.com and follow the instructions on the Reciprocity Application.

Please allow 7-14 business days for Application processing. You will be notified via email once your application has been processed. This email will include instructions on how to log into your TMU personal portal to pay your testing fees, schedule your testing appointments and change your address, email or phone number if applicable.

If your certification has lapsed less than 6 months and you have met the minimum requirement of completing 200 hours of paid employment under the direction of a RN or LPN, you are not required to retest. You will be required to submit your renewal form along with appropriate late fees.

If you are 6 to 24 months late or have failed to meet the minimum renewal requirements, complete this application and submit it to UNAR for approval and processing. You must successfully complete both the knowledge and skill certification exams within 24 months of your expiration date to maintain certification. Candidates are granted 3 attempts to successfully pass both exams. If you do not successfully pass either test, you will be required to complete an approved nursing assistant training program.

CONSENT TO RELEASE OF INFORMATION

I understand that upon successful completion of the nurse aide training and competency evaluation program, my name, address, date of birth, social security number, and name and date of the state-approved training and competency evaluation program will be entered into the Utah Nursing Assistant Registry.

I understand that any allegation of resident abuse, neglect, or misappropriation of property will be thoroughly investigated by the State of Utah Health Facility Licensing & Certification agency and that the State of Utah shall ensure that a reasonable opportunity for a hearing has been offered to the nursing assistant.

I understand that any substantiated allegation, along with a statement submitted by the nursing assistant disputing the findings, or, if applicable, any statement by the individual waiving his/her rights to a hearing, will be entered into the abuse registry. I understand that by law this information must be available to the public.

I certify that I have read R432-45-6 Certified Nurse Aide Misconduct.

I certify that the information given above is true and accurate.

I have not worked the required 200 paid hours in the previous 24-month period.

I have passed the 6-month grace period to renew my certificate and must now retest.
